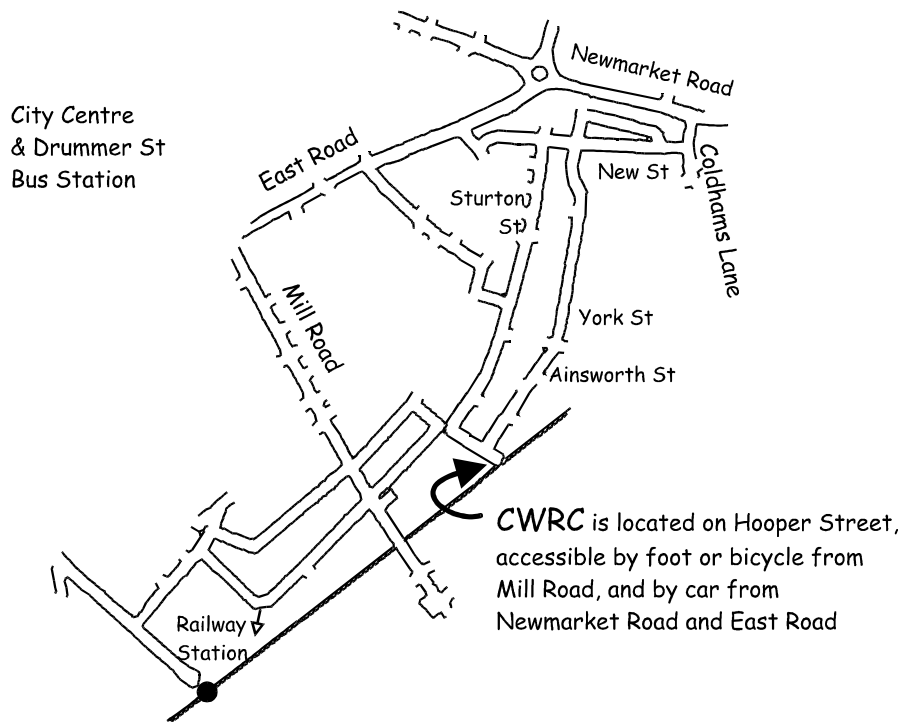

If you are new to the centre, you may wish to come in and get to know us: You are welcome to drop in to use the coffee room or library between 9:30am and 3:30pm during term time.

What happens at CWRC?

We offer a range of learning, social and creative opportunities both at the Centre and in the Community. Through our Training department, we offer courses in Computing, Woodwork, English, Maths and ESOL. We also provide Lifestyle Courses to increase your confidence and personal skills; these include subjects such as jobsearch and creative writing. Most of our vocational courses lead to nationally recognised qualifications. Please ask for a leaflet on any area that interests you.

What else?

We offer career guidance and support to women using the centre, as well as drop-in facilities including an Information Room, job and study notice boards. Our Information, Advice and Guidance services are accredited to the matrix quality standard.

Childcare is currently free to women attending LSC-funded courses at the centre. The crèche is run by qualified and experienced staff. Our main focus is on free play, although we do have organised activities and opportunities for art, music and story times every session.
